

Art Week

As a school we feel that creative arts are a very important part of the curriculum and by having an arts week, children can have an immersive experience over a sustained period of time. This gives them opportunities to reflect on their outcomes which they can then revisit. When children are creative and use their imagination, they are given the opportunity to be curious and investigate the world in which we live.



The children have been inspired by realist painter Victoria Mac Dermott, Victoria has been the schools 'artist in residence' for the week, leading workshops and teaching new art skills to the children. She, the children and staff have been joined by many parent helpers who have enjoyed their time being creative and having fun working along side their children.



As well as drawing fish and sea creatures from observation, children have been collaging, marbling, painting, sculpting clay fish, using recyclable materials to make jellyfish and creating large scale willow fish and a turtle. They even investigated real fish right down to gutting and preparing for cooking. They also had the chance at participating in traditional archery and different health and well being workshops.

Enrichment Week

A reminder of kit list should have gone home this week for children doing activity days. Kit list can be found on our website-Newsletter section and here is a little reminder also..

Please make sure that Sun cream has been applied before school and that each child has some with them which can be reapplied throughout the day. They will not be allowed to share sun cream other than with siblings.

Beach – Children are allowed to bring a bucket and spade. Children will need to wear a school t-shirt but can wear their own shorts/trousers and shoes. Packed lunch & plenty to drink.

Haven Banks – comfortable clothing (not jeans), lightweight coat, packed lunch & drink, change of clothes, sun hat, towel and a bag to put dirty/wet clothes in.

Bear Trail – Children will need to wear old clothes as they are expected to get extremely dirty. They will need a packed lunch, drink, spare set of clothes, towel and labelled bag to put dirty clothes in.

Forest school – Class 3 will be going to forest school from camping so please ensure they have stuff for this day when packing. They will return to school in time for lunch.

Year 6 – On Friday the Year 6's will be treated to a trip to Crealy. The children will need to wear their school logoed t-shirt/jumper but can wear their own trousers/shorts and comfortable shoes. They will also need to bring a packed lunch, drink, sun cream, money for them to spend in the shop (£10 maximum), waterproof coat and a spare pair of clothes and towel – we get very wet at the end on the bumper boats.



Please can you ensure you put Sun cream on your child before they start nursery, this gives us more time to spend with your children in the mornings, thank you!
