What should you do if a pupil tests positive for Coronavirus during May half term?

School staff will be available during the May half term to support pupils and parents/carers in relation to contact tracing after a positive Coronavirus test result. If a pupil tests positive for Coronavirus having developed symptoms within 48 hours of being in school (i.e. on or before Sunday 30th May, we can assist in identifying close contacts and advising them to self-isolate. This is because the individual may have been infectious while in school. We can also support a staff member who tests positive in this way, and therefore will ensure any pupils or staff who were close contacts are informed.
